

How did AGSO project WGS84 to Cocos (Keeling) Islands?

February 2000: AGSO projected the data from Geographic (WGS84) to Cocos (Keeling) Islands Grid 1992 using ArcView 3.2a projection utility. Deleted erroneous polygons (large area, small visible extent) from shapefile after checking that they were spatially non-unique and contained no attributes.

When did Geoscience Australia use the Cocos (Keeling) Islands cadastre?

August 2004: Geoscience Australia was supplied with the latest Cocos (Keeling) Islands cadastre by DOLA in Western Australia as an ESRI shapefile. This included for the first time a polygon for North Keeling Island which outlined the coast. The following steps were carried out to merge the cadastre with previously collected ground audit data:

How do the Cocos (Keeling) Islands communicate?

The Cocos (Keeling) Islands have access to a range of modern communication services. Digital television stations are broadcast from Western Australia via satellite. A local radio station, 6CKI - Voice of the Cocos (Keeling) Islands, is staffed by community volunteers and provides some local content.

What is the difference between Cocos and Keeling Islands?

The islands have been called the Cocos Islands (from 1622), the Keeling Islands (from 1703), the Cocos-Keeling Islands (since James Horsburgh in 1805) and the Keeling-Cocos Islands (19th century). Cocos refers to the abundant coconut trees, while Keeling refers to William Keeling, who discovered the islands in 1609.

Are Horsburgh Island and North Keeling Atoll included in this dataset?

Annexed by the UK in 1857, the Cocos Islands were transferred to the Australian Government in 1955. Apart from North Keeling Island, which lies 30 kilometers north of the main group, the islands form a horseshoe-shaped atoll surrounding a lagoon. North Keeling Island was declared a national park in 1995 and is administered by Parks Australia.
