

We'll cover the Icelandic alphabet and the basics of Icelandic pronunciation, as well as some of the hardest Icelandic words and names. Foreigners often complain over or admire the Icelandic language; however, almost everyone agrees that it's difficult to learn.

Icelandic orthography uses a Latin-script alphabet which has 32 letters. Compared with the 26 letters of English, the Icelandic alphabet lacks C, Q, W and Z, but additionally has &#208;, &#222;, &#198; and &#214;. Six letters have forms with acute accents to produce &#193;, &#201;, &#205;, &#211;, &#218; and &#221;.

Iceland (Icelandic: &#205;sland; [ˈistlant] (listen)) is an island country between the North Atlantic and Arctic, between Greenland and Norway, formerly a possession of Denmark. It is culturally considered to be part of Europe. Iceland is 301 kilometers east of Greenland and 1001 kilometers west of Norway.
