

Wie kann man Strom und Wärme für längere Zeit speichern?

Grundsätzlich gibt es Möglichkeiten Strom und Wärme für längere Zeit zu speichern. Jedoch eignen sich die wenigsten für den privaten Gebrauch. Die meisten Langzeitspeicher werden für große Solarparks gebaut. Während die Solaranlagen im Sommer jede Menge Strom produzieren können, sieht das im Winter anders aus.

Wie hoch ist die saisonale Speicherkapazität?

Die Studie hebt hervor, dass saisonale Speicherkapazitäten von rund 130 TWh erforderlich sind, um die Versorgungssicherheit zu gewährleisten. Die Fraunhofer ISE-Studie skizziert verschiedene Szenarien, die den Weg zu einer klimaneutralen Energieversorgung bis 2045 aufzeigen.

Was ist ein Langzeitspeicher?

Langzeitspeicher ermöglichen es den Solarstrom über den Winter hinweg zu speichern. Genau in diesen Fall spricht man von Langzeitspeichern oder auch Saisonspeichern. Also Speichern, die durchaus in der Lage sind Wärme oder Strom über den Winter hinweg zu lagern. Das würde den Autarkiegrad in der Theorie deutlich erhöhen.

Welche Speichertechnologien gibt es in der Zukunft?

Speichertechnologien bleiben auch in der Zukunft essenziell. Während Wasserstoff vor allem für industrielle Anwendungen und als Langzeitspeicher vorgesehen ist, übernehmen Batteriespeicher und andere Kurzzeitspeicher die Aufgabe, kurzfristige Schwankungen im Stromnetz auszugleichen.

Like the islands themselves, places to stay in Wallis and Futuna are small and friendly.
